


Daisy Room School Readiness Activities

Literacy

- * Read familiar & new stories & talk about the characters, setting & events. Encourage recall of stories at a later date. Tell stories orally without any pictures & recall.
- * Recognition of own name the first letter should be a capital letter & the rest lower case. Make a puzzle out of the letters to reassemble, print lots of copies of name to hide & play a name hunt (add a few different names to see if child notices!)
- * Lots of drawing/writing' (shapes, marks, letter-like shapes or real letters which child gives meaning to e.g. "It's says...")



Expressive Art & Design

- * Make models from construction kits & junk materials. Decide what to make before starting & talk about how to do it.
- * Sing some familiar songs & learn some new ones. There are lots on VouTubel
- * Imaginative play what can you use as props? Who or what can you pretend to be?




Personal, Social & **Emotional** Development

- * Help with simple tasks around the home
- * Tidy up toys when they are finished
- * Play turn taking games.

Communication, Language & Literacy

- * Talk, talk, talk! Encourage talk about everything - what is happening in the here & now, what might happen in the future, what has happened in the past.
- * Ask questions (but not too many!) - 'How?', 'Why?'
- * Play listening & attention games e.g Kim,s game, shopping game, Simon Says.



Which shape did you find most of?





Mathematics

- * Regular practise counting orally to 5, 10, 20 or beyond. Count claps, jumps or steps, matching each number to each action.
- * Count small groups of objects, saying one number for each object. Encourage pointing to each object while counting. Match to the correct numeral.
- *Go on a shape hunt.

- TV remote, digital camera, smart phone camera, tablet.
- * Complete simple games on a tablet or computer.
- * Look at photos, videos or on Streetview at places I like to visit & talk about them e.g. park, shops, beach, castle, farm.

Physical Development

- * Practise developing a strong pincer grip (thumb & index finger) ready for holding a pencil - squeeze clothes pegs, pick up tiny objects with thumb & index finger or use tweezers, squeeze playdough between thumb & index finger.
- * If you have child safe scissors encourage holding correctly with thumb at top, make snips in paper, cut along lines & around shapes.
- * Learn how to put own shoes, coat & other clothing on independently.
- * Manage going to the toilet myself & pulling clothing down & up independently. Practise washing hands properly.
